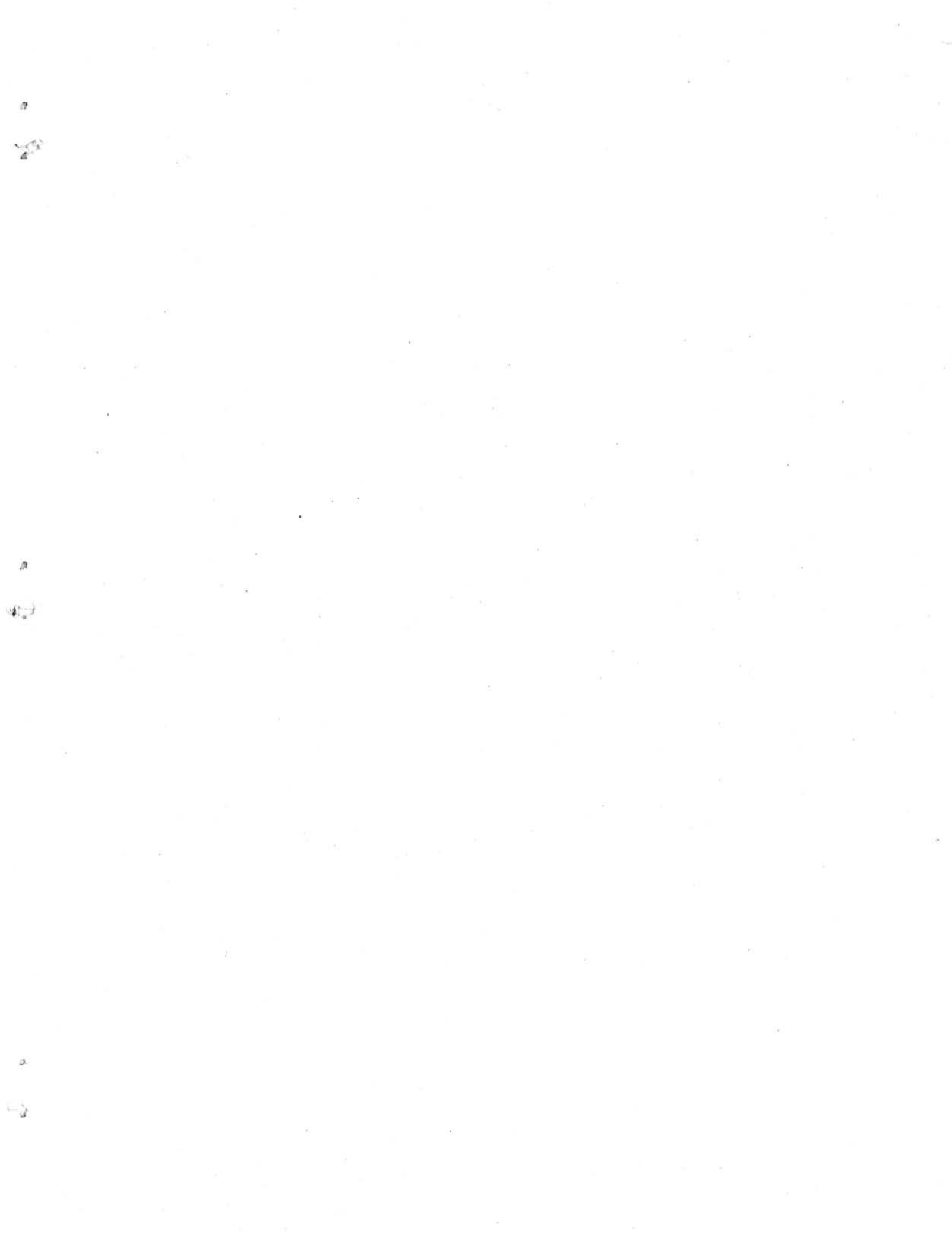



# A History of Clewiston

Early Florida history indicates that the Clewiston area was first used as a campsite by the Indians as they fished the bass-laden waters of Lake Okeechobee. Centuries later, fishing was to become the first recorded enterprise in the area; the sandy beach and natural inlet of Sand point, now the site of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regional office, served as base of operations for scores of professional fishermen as late as the 1920's.

The Clewiston area also attracted its share of early adventurers and pioneer farmers, most notable a temporary settlement of Japanese farmers who began to grow beautiful vegetables in the fertile lakeside soil about 1915.

The first permanent development was undertaken in 1920 by Philadelphia investors John and Marion O'Brien and Tampa banker Alonzo Clewis, who purchased a substantial tract of land surrounding the picturesque lake shore and set about to establish a town. The O'Briens and Clewis soon had a railroad line, the "M.H. and C", built to connect Clewiston with the Atlantic Coast Line terminus at Moore Haven.

They then commissioned the well-known town planner John Nolen of Boston, to create a plan for the city, and they hired the firm of Elliot and Harmon of Peoria and Memphis to survey and map out the drainage district, which included the town, and to direct construction of streets and canals.

Many of this early group remained to become permanent residents, founding schools and churches, opening stores, and establishing other needed business and professional services.

Within a few years, the rich muck-lands around Clewiston attracted a group of Midwesterners interested in emulating the successful cultivation of sugarcane already undertaken on the lake's eastern shore by F. Edward Bryant.

Extensive sugarcane plantations were laid out and the first crops were so rich and abundant it was easy even then to envision Clewiston's future as a sugar center.

Following two disastrous storms in 1926 and 1928, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers carried out a federal project to help control the waters of Lake Okeechobee, thereby creating even more land suitable for cultivation and putting Clewiston well on the road to achieving its status as the heart of the United States sugar bowl.

During the 1930s, Clewiston's population continued to grow and the town's commercial and social activities gradually became more diversified.

During the 1940s, at the onset of World War II, British Flying Training School Number Five was established at nearby Riddle Field.

Here young pilots trained for the Royal Air Force. Many of these air cadets formed lasting friendships with the people of Clewiston and they and their families return to the town even today to visit with their Southern "Yank" friends. In 1989 many of the group returned to Clewiston for a two-day reunion and to commemorate the American Memorial Day.

By the 1950s and 1960s, citrus, winter vegetables, and cattle had become important to the economic growth of the area.

In recent years, due to freezes in north Florida, more acreage is being planted citrus.

Clewiston's largest industry, however, was, and is, sugar, and the town has become known as "America's sweetest town", thanks to the activities of the United States Sugar Corporation.

Clewiston's location on U.S. Highway 27 places it in an important cross-roads of both local and south Florida traffic and the seasonal influx of tourists from colder climates--many of whom have chosen to make this pleasant little town their year-round home.

Lake Okeechobee still abounds in huge bass and vast numbers of other fish.

And, in continuing its Indian heritage, Clewiston has become a nationally renowned sport fishing center with tourist accommodations available all-year.

Clewiston's temperature climate and tranquil palm-filled vistas make it a town for all seasons....

### CLIMATE....

The average annual temperature is 74.2 degrees; the average for July is 82.7, and February, 64.4.

There is an average annual rainfall of about 40 inches, most of which arrives in the form of summer showers.

The sun shines nearly every day, and there are few cold days in Clewiston.

We are a friendly little town of 6,500 people way out in the middle of everywhere -- 60 miles east of Fort Myers on the Gulf of Mexico and 60 miles west of Palm Beach on the Atlantic Ocean.

Although we are not a large tourist center, many visitors are attracted to Clewiston because of the excellent fresh-water fishing in Lake Okeechobee.

There is a seldom-covered, well-maintained municipal 18-hole golf course. The city-owned tennis courts are lighted for night play.

We enjoy a quiet way of life hard to find in today's busy world. Clewiston is a peaceful place for pleasant people.

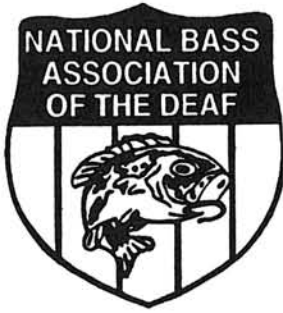

I am grateful to General Chairman Wayne O. Mart and his planning committee for working with the NBAD Board this year. Every ten years the NBAD Board hosts a tournament. Other times the tournament is hosted by a local club that has bid and won the votes of all affiliated clubs. We are glad to be hosting the 20th Anniversary and hope this will be one of your finest fishing events. I am confident in its success because of every one's hard work.

Our NBAD tournament is being hosted in Florida for the first time. I am excited to be here at Lake Okeechobee. This lake has been very popular for bass tournaments.

NBAD is very grateful to the Missouri Deaf Bass Anglers, Inc. for their donation this year of \$1000 to purchase a digital signboard to go with the electronic scales and to be

used for our NBAD tournament. Now everyone will be able to see the weights of the fish during the weigh-in. This is the first time NBAD has received such a generous donation.

NBAD records were established in our 1994 tournament at Table Rock Lake, MO.

A record of 186 participants, a record of 25 affiliated clubs, and the Top 6 winners were from Indiana with a record catch of 122.35 lbs.

1992 lunger record still holds with Jerry Belew's 9.04 pounder at Lake Ouachita, ARK.

1983 at Lake Eufaula, Oklahoma still claims two records:

Gene Amons, Bassmaster, with 44 lbs. 4 oz.

Gene Amons and Harry Trahan, Team Champions, with 85 lbs. 14 oz.

1991 at Kentucky Lake still holds the record of fish caught during our three-day tournament:

615 bass weighed in at 961.85 lbs.

This year we hope to see more records set at Lake Okeechobee.

These three have attended all 20 NBAD tournaments.

NBAD Headquarters will be at Mountain Harbor Resort on Lake Ouachita in Hot Springs, Arkansas. Host will be Little Rock Bass Anglers of the Deaf. Chairperson is Rondale Ketchum. Guaranteed \$5000 prize for winning team.

### 2000

This year's tournament is up for bid at Florida during the meeting on Monday, June 12.



## Results of Questionnaire given out at the 1994 Tournament:

A questionnaire was given out to the 90 boat owners that took part in the 1994 tournament. I received answers back from only 34 owners.

**Boat manufacturers:** **Ranger** ranked the most numerous with 10 owners. Stratos and Bass Tracker each had 4 owners. Two owners of each of these: Lund, Nitro, ProCraft. Only one owner of each of these: Bass Cat, Monark, Grambler, Javelin, Skeeter, Cajun, Champion, Dem Craft, Ensign, and Baretta.

**Motor Manufacturers:** Most of the boats were equipped with Mercury (13), then Evinrude (9), Johnson (8), Mariner (2), Yamaha and Force each 1.

**Motor HP:** The most popular horsepower is 150 (10), then 115 (5), then 75 (3). There were two with 200, 75, and 175 HP. One boat each had 50, 60, 70, 85, 90, 100, 110, 120, 135, and 225 HP.

**Trolling Motor Manufacturer:** More than half the boats (that I received responses) were equipped with Motor Guide trolling motors (19 boats). Then six boats had Minn Kota, three boats had Evinrude, another three had Johnson, and one boat each with Eagle, Mariner, and Mercury trolling motors.

**Depth Finder Manufacturer:** Several boats had more than one depth finder. The one on nearly every boat is the Lowrance (27). Boat owners had 19 Humminbirds, 17 Eagles and 2 Apelcos.

**Favorite Fishing Rods:** Some of the anglers answered more than one, but ten anglers had no preferences. The ones most frequently mentioned were the Quantum (4), Berkley (4), All-Star (3), ABU Garcia (3), Fenwick (2), St. Croix (2), Browning (2), and Daiwa (2). Some others mentioned once were Eagle, Shakespear, Liberty, and Bionic Blade.

**Favorite Fishing Reels:** Six anglers said that they would use any reel-no preferences. The most popular reel is the ABU Garcia (12), and the Daiwa (8), followed by Quantum (6), Shimano (3), Lews (2), Mitchell (2), and Bantam (1), and Zebco (1).

**Favorite Fishing Line:**

Stren and Berkley/Trilene were each preferred by 14 anglers. Silver Thread and Spiderwire were each mentioned by 3 anglers.

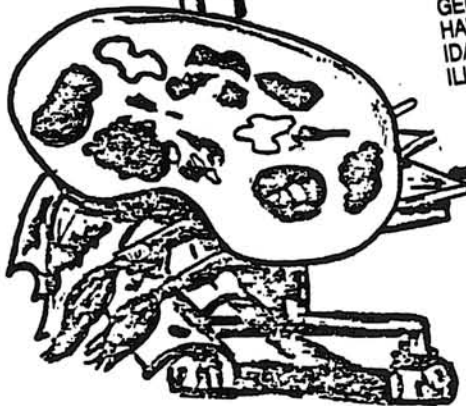

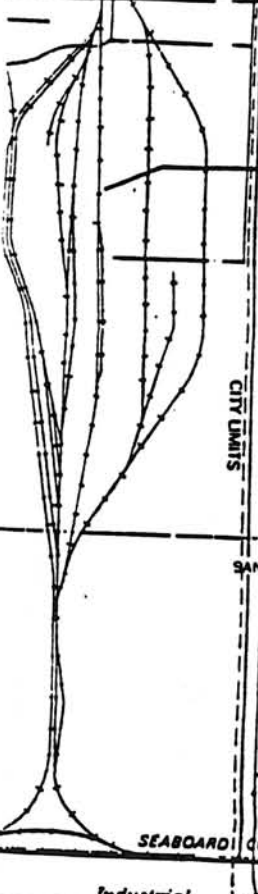
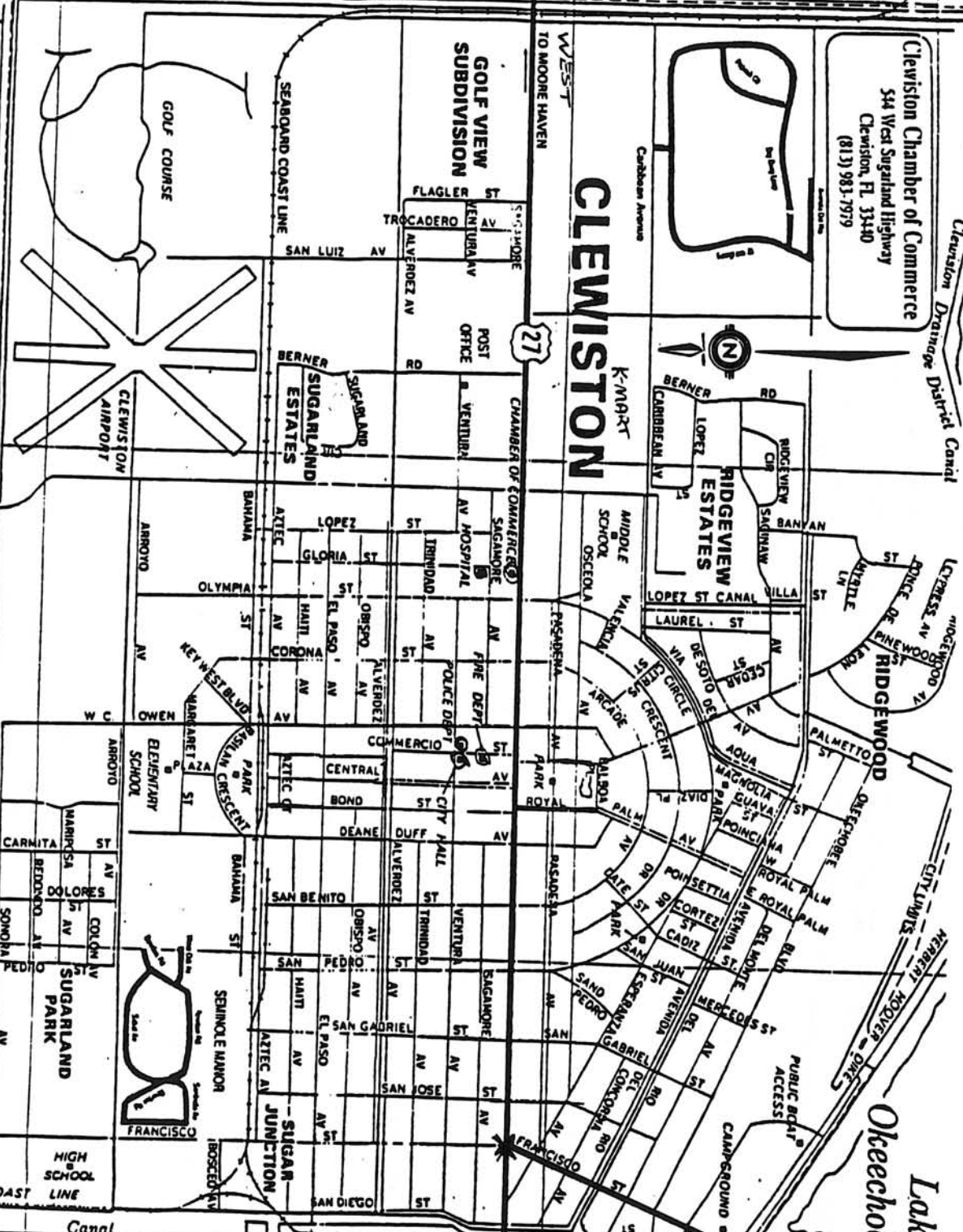

## Gator facts



### Avoiding attacks

- ☞ Avoid swimming in waters known to be inhabited by alligators, particularly during summer when alligators are most active.
- ☞ Dogs and cats are the size animals that alligators tend to favor. Don't follow pets into water if alligators are known to be present.
- ☞ Cleaning fish and discarding parts into the water is likely to attract alligators. Swimming or even dangling feet into water where fish have been cleaned can be extremely dangerous.
- ☞ Using your feet or hands to search in the water for golf balls can be dangerous, too.

**Sunday:** Grace Eberhart, 70, was attacked at Lake Serenity in the Continental Country Club near Wildwood in Sumter County. The alligator was a 9'7" male.

**June 19:** Bradley Weidenhamer, 10, was attacked while wading in the Loxahatchee River at Jonathon Dickinson State Park in Martin County. The Alligator was an 11'4" male.

**June 4, 1988:** Erin Glover, 4, was attacked while walking along the shore of Hidden Lake in Charlotte County. The alligator was a 10'7" male.

**July 13, 1987:** George Cummings III, 29, was attacked while snorkeling in the Wakulla River in Jefferson County. The alligator was an 11' male.

**Aug. 6, 1984:** Robert Crespo, 11, was attacked while swimming in a canal in St. Lucie County. The alligator was 12'4".

**Sept. 28, 1977:** George Leonard, 52, was attacked while swimming in the Peace River Canal in Charlotte County. The alligator was a 7' female.

**Aug. 16, 1973:** Sharon Holmes, 16, was attacked while swimming in Scherer State Park in Sarasota County. The alligator was a 11'3" male.

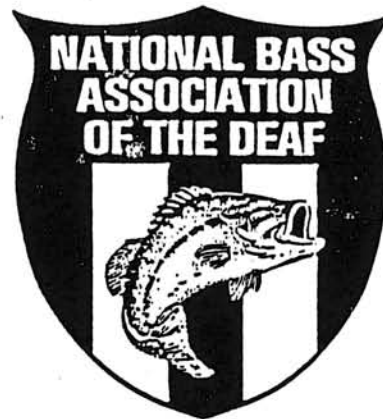

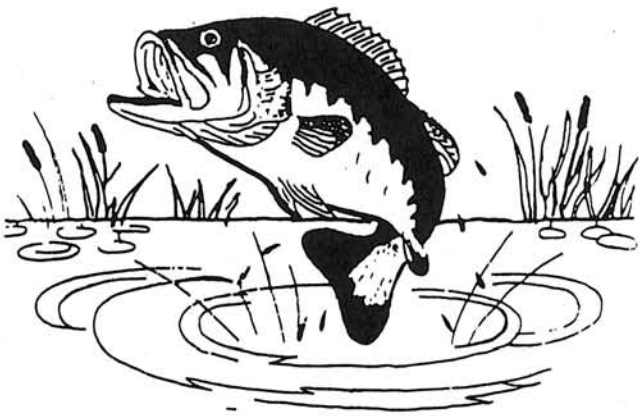
