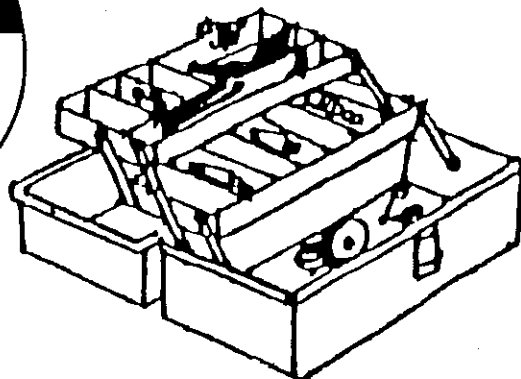
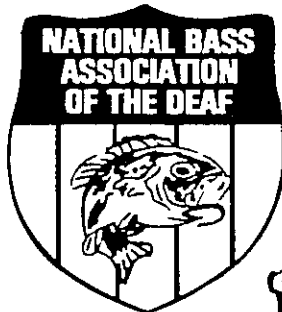

The 18th Annual N.B.A.D. Team Tournament will be hold at Lake West Point at LaGrange, Georgia on June 15, 16, 17, 1993.

The Headquarter site will be bloacted at Highland Marina & Resort about 2 or 4 miles off Route 109.

The Indiana Bass Association of the Deaf will sponsor the tournament under chairmanship of Winferd Larkin and his committee.

The First place team winner will be guaranteed to receive \$2,000.00.

This will be the first time for Georgia to have a N.B.A.D. team tournament.

New fishing club formed for deaf in Pennsylvania, N.J.

A new fishing club has been established for deaf people in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

The Penn-Jersey Deaf Bass Anglers was established last February as a non-profit organization by Larry Sabatini of Pennsylvania, who had noticed that many deaf people belonged to fishing clubs for hearing people but had trouble communicating with other members.

According to Sabatini, the purpose of the club is to share information, teach one another fishing "tricks," and learn how to purchase fishing equipment.

Twenty-one other states have fishing clubs for the deaf and hard of hearing. Sabatini said the Penn-Jersey Deaf Bass Anglers will be affiliated with the National Bass Association for the Deaf.

The club now has 45 members and has elected the following officers: Chris Jones, president; John Mines, vice-president; Kathy Sabatini, treasurer; Patti Galletti, secretary; Larry Sabatini, director for Pennsylvania; Dominick Galletti, director for New Jersey.

The club held a bass tournament in August at DeFeo's Cove Marina in Greenwood Lake, N.Y. Dominick Galletti was the chairperson. Eighteen people participated, with Leroy Ste-

vens and Marlin Boehmer capturing first prize; Dominick Gattelli and John Mines in 2nd place; and Larry Sabatini and Bruce Bownman in 3rd place.

Minutes of NBAD Tournament Meetings

17th Annual National Bass Association of the Deaf
Executive Board Meeting
Sunday, June 14, 1992
Office area of the Mountain Harbor Resort located on Lake Ouachita in
Arkansas.

President Alan Rork called the meeting to order at 8:10 a.m.

The Executive Board members who were present:

Minutes of June 9, 1991 Executive Board meeting were accepted as they stand.

Treasurer's report was audited by Winfred Larkin, Indiana
Jack Zeigler, Ohio
and Stanley Ketchum, Arkansas.

William Schwall explained his son-in-law is a CPA and some of the items need to be clarified. For instance our NBAD formula for the Entry Fee (\$50.00). This needs to be clarified in disbursements as:

It was suggested that each year we send our financial statement to Schwall's son-in-law or someone willing to look it over to make suggestions on how to improve it.

General Chairman's Report—William Schwall

The resort managers are Patty Brown and Bill Barnes, and the marina manager is Allen Reynolds.

One woman from California has many "ILY" items to sell, and Schwall gave her permission with understanding that 10% will go to Host.

It is still understood that the next year's Host Club can sell items after the Wednesday night prizes are awarded.

Schwall has picked someone to take photos and videotapes.

Interpreter is his daughter, Kristy Schwall.

Patty Brown and Bill Barnes donated the T-shirts for the winners and the hats for NBAD officers.

Schwall has notified marina and other bait shops nearby to have plenty of Non-Resident fishing licenses ready.

Schedule:

Monday--

1. Big Lunker contest. Time to start will depend on fog. It has been very foggy lately.
2. Also Bobby Murray, ex Bass Master Classic champ will be a guest speaker.
3. Also Arkansas Games and Fish Commission will bring a mobile aquarium and present a seminar.
4. Registration for NBAD tournament will be 8 a.m. to 11 a.m.
5. Weigh-in at 11 a.m.
6. General Assembly at 1 p.m.
7. Jr. NBAD Derby will be 6 to 8 p.m. with free hot dogs and drinks for all children plus prizes.

Tuesday--

Team Tournament starts. Boat check will be on the "T" fuel dock. All boats must be in the headquarter's "no wake buoy area by 3:00 p.m. or will be disqualified. Numbers on the boats will be orange and black. The weigh-in station was given to us to use by Porter Everett Boat & Tackle Mart, free of charge. Scales are ready. NBAD Secretary will serve as witness. Weigh-in at 3:00 p.m. with announcement of winners at 7:00 p.m. Also will have drawing of crafts and Hall of Fame awards.

Wednesday--

After the tournament, weigh-in, and announcement of winners, will have door prize drawings.

Thursday--

After the tournament, weigh-in, and announcement of winners for the day and for the 3-days total and presentation of prizes to winners, we will have a drawing for TV with closed captions.

Everyday in the evenings, the host club will sell popcorn, nachos and cheese, sandwiches, coffee, pop, etc. at the conference building where the meetings will be held and prizes will be given.

There is much concern about weather and foggy conditions in the early mornings. This just happened to us at this time. No one can be blamed for this.

**Charles Marsh moves that for this year only we prolong the tournament until 4:00 p.m. each day. Robert Southwell seconded.

Winfred Larkin moves to start the tournament at 6:00 a.m. Jack Stigers seconded. Amendment passed. Main motion passed.**

President's Report—Alan Rork

1. Alan Rork gave out agenda for Executive Board meeting, Council of Representative's meeting, and General Meeting.

2. Discussion on the metal boat flags. Suggestion to make them floatable. NBAD Board members agreed to try them this year (Board members only).

** means that the motion will be presented to the Council of Representative's meeting

3. Decal Specialities, Inc. had printed our NBAD decals but the company is now closed. We are trying to find someone to print smaller decal (3" x 4"). This is very expensive.

Charles Marsh moves that we go ahead and order 3" X 4" decals. Robert Southwell seconded. Passed.

William Schwall knows of a printing business owned by a Deaf person that might be able to do this cheaper than others. See program book--Record Printing which is owned by Tommy Walker.

4. Northern California Angling and Camping Club of the Deaf and Sacramento Valley Silent Anglers will not bid for the 22nd Annual NBAD Team Tournament in 1997 to be held in the Western Division.

**Secretary will inform Council of Representatives that any affiliate club can bid for 1997 tournament to be held in the Western Division.

5. In the Guidelines for NBAD Tournament Host: Guideline #4 says "The Host cannot make a bid to be host for a future tournament. That host must wait until the following year to make a bid."

Robert Southwell moves that this statement be deleted from the guidelines. Winfred Larkin seconded. Passed.

6. Postage and phone bills are high because of more letters and correspondence by phone. We need to work on how to save money on expenses.

7. During general meeting we need to clarify quota fees to everyone. Martin Miller will explain in meeting.

8. NBAD needs funds for the 20th Annual Tournament which will be hosted by NBAD. A lottery idea was shared with executive board members and such an idea could work under charity donations.

Martin Miller moves that the Donations Chairperson be in charge of the lottery for our 20th Annual Tournament. Winfred Larkin seconded. Passed.

Vice President's Report—Martin Miller

Martin Miller wants to change the Application form so that it is more clear to send this to him and that he needs everyone's address.

Secretary's Report—Elen Zook

Wrote to NCI September, 1991 (NBAD secretary had previously sent them letters in November, 1990 and March, 1991). We still have not received a reply.

Wrote to Caption Center in February, 1992. Have not received a reply from them either.

What should be our next step? Suggestions to call NCI and Caption Center. Contact the Nashville TV station. Talk to Basil Bacon.

Wrote letter to all affiliated clubs, sending them the Gator Grip catalog and also asking them for ideas for motto for our organization. No one replied.

Worked on the September, 1991 Tackle Box Newsletter. Sent all photos to our Noblesville Ledger to have half-tones made. Then had to re-copy all the pages that had pictures. Then Alan Rork and his wife, Jo; Jack Stigers and his wife, Diana; and my husband, Jack and I all put the newsletter together and put in envelopes to mail.

Put all affiliated club members addresses on computer. Made labels to mail the NBAD Host's flyers. Gave to treasurer to mail.

Worked on History Book. Sent all photos to Noblesville Ledger to get half-tones made. Copied the last half of the book. Had to re-do page numbers and make a new content page when Broz sent me extra pages. Jo Rork got the other half copied at her work, then Alan and Jo stapled and put it together.

Treasurer's Report—Jack Stigers

Last year was short \$60.00. One participant was listed as paid but did not pay.

Entry fee form needs the addresses of both partners.

Bought money orders for winner's prizes to be given instead of cash.

Publicity Director's Report—Alan Rork for Joseph Broz

NBAD is sorry to lose our valuable publicity director, Joseph O. Broz who passed away last February.

Last year Karl Nygaard and Dianne Oppriecht of Wisconsin helped save NBAD a lot of money for printing the Tackle Box newsletter. Dianne broke her wrist and was unable to help this year.

September Tackle Box newsletter was printed where Jack Stigers works then some pages (with photos) had to be recopied by Elen Zook. The the March Tackle Box was printed where Jo Rork works, at the print shop in Anderson Community Schools.

Joseph Broz and Elen Zook completed the History Book and this will be sold this year. Suggested price of \$1.00 by Board members.

A new NBAD Publicity Director will be elected from among qualified members at the General Assembly to fill Joe's vacancy. A qualified member must have participated in the NBAD tournament two times and is a member of an affiliated bass club.

Lifetime Executive Member—Robert Southwell

Would like to have in addition to the yearly plaques to winners, a special 3-year plaque. For the first year, winners will take home and bring back. The second year winners will take home and bring back. The third year winners will take home and keep.

Discussion on how to avoid congestion at the fish holding tanks near weigh-in station.

Robert Southwell moves that "A" stay in boat with fish and "B" come to get in line. Host will inform "B" when to get partner and fish. First to come will be first to weigh fish. "First come, first served." Charles Marsh seconded. Passed.

Robert Southwell feels we do not need to order more hats. Alan Rork informed yes, we have plenty, when we sell out, we will not buy more.

Robert Southwell moves that \$1.00 registration fee be charged to fans (adults). Host will be responsible for this and can keep the money. William Schwall seconded. Passed.

Executive Board Member—Charles Marsh

His concern that President Rork is doing too much correspondence. Secretary is sister and lives close, she should be doing more of the correspondence and make it less burden for president.

Host must give team champions a T-shirt. This has not been done in the past. Need to write to those clubs who have not given champions their T-shirts.

Asked Schwall if monthly reports were made. He did not see any. Schwall answered yes and sent copies to President and to Secretary. Marsh was satisfied. One report that he feels all the board members should see is the financial report.

Hall of Fame certificates are ready for Board signatures.

1993 General Chairman's Report—Winfred Larkin

He visited the resort during Spring vacation. People need to write their reservations, not phone them. Everything seems to be in order and ready for NBAD.

Weigh-in should be much easier and close to where boats can bring fish.

REMINDER for next year Board Meeting--Motto????????????

William Schwall adds there will be bus tour for fans to Hot Springs on Tuesday and Wednesday. Cost will be \$5.00 each. Have a TDD available and the conference building will have a TV with decoder.

Alan Rork explained about the National Deaf Sport Fishing Records organization funds being claimed by family of Joseph O. Broz because it was not incorporated. NBAD received all property back because we are incorporated, so we were safe to get all things back. The other two staff members contributed money from their own personal funds, but it is not enough to keep this going. Perhaps we can ask for donation during the General Assembly. Joseph Broz did a lot for NBAD and deaf fishing records. We should try to help keep it going in his honor.

Minutes of June 9, 1991, Council of Representative's meeting were accepted with changes:

Motion 1 states a penalty of two ounces will be deducted for each fish -- this should state for each DEAD fish. That will be .13 on metric scale.

Motion X states it was out of order. This is error. It should state that it failed because no one seconded.

Treasurer's Report:

Mack Wilson cannot understand why for quota fees collected it shows a few members but the participants are many.

William Schwall reports the aquarium will arrive tomorrow. Lunker contest will also start 6:00 a.m. and end at 11:00 a.m. Participants must arrive within the marina no-wake buoys by 11:00 a.m. or be disqualified.

Publicity Director's Report:

Alan Rork reports for Joseph O. Broz.

Thanks to Karl Nygaard for previous help on printing NBAD Tackle Box newsletter. September issue was printed at Jack Stiger's work place and pages with pictures were redone by Elen Zook. March issue was printed by Anderson Community Schools print shop. Joseph Broz and Elen Zook completed the History Book and it will be for sale for \$1.00.

Entry Forms:

Jack Stigers reports as of now we have 140 participants. The form states "No refunds after May 15, 1992" so if someone cannot fish, cannot get refund now.

We need both team members names and addresses together on the forms.

Top Six Club:

Robert Southwell reports he would like to give out a Three-Year Plaque in addition to the yearly plaque that is given.

Unfinished Business:

New Business:

Motion III: Little Rock Bass Anglers of the Deaf Inc. moves that

A. The host must give at least the \$2,500 minimum to the team champion. Danny Cochran seconded. William Schwall (Mack Wilson) moves to close discussion-passed. Main motion passed 23-0 and is effective 1997.

B. Any bass club not paying quota dues to NBAD before NBAD Tournament in 60 days, NBAD will charge \$25.00 fine. William Schwall seconded. Jack Zook (Ron Stanford) moves to close discussion-passed. Main motion failed 1-16.

B. NBAD shall be involved with Luncker Contest on Monday from now on. Ken Stehle seconded. Passed 13-4.

C. Reconsider to kill the vote of the motion that Host pay half and NBAD officers pay half on the lodge expenses during the annual tournament. And have our old motion that Host pay a full rate on the lodge for the NBAD officers effective next year. Winfred Larkin seconded. Mack Wilson amends to pay for family and children only.
