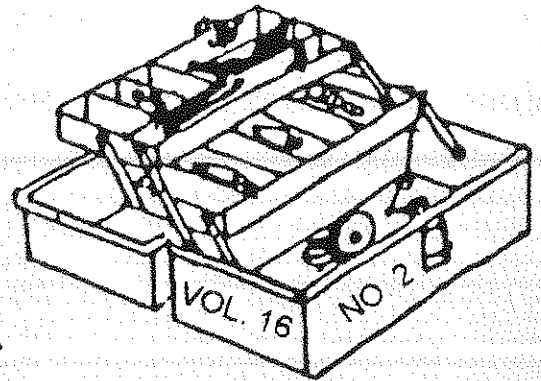

19TH ANNUAL NBAD TEAM TOURNAMENT

June 15, 16, 17, 1994

The 19th Annual National Bass Tournament of the Deaf Team Tournament was held at Table Rock Lake near Branson, Missouri. Headquarters were located at the Indian Point Marina. This year's tournament was directed by General Chairman Edgar Long and sponsored by the Missouri Deaf Bass Anglers, Inc.

The new attendance record for our NBAD tournaments was broken this year with 188 paid entries. We had 54 rookies, plus two others who paid but could not attend. This is the record breaking number of rookies, which almost exceeded the number of participants in our first tournament in 1976. In 1976, the NBAD tournaments originated with 62 participants.

Of the 186 entries this year, 24 states and Canada were represented.

We have 25 affiliated clubs this year, new clubs are Florida Bass Association of the Deaf, Kentucky Deaf Bass Anglers, Reel Excitement Anglers of the Deaf, and the Memphis Athletic Association of the Deaf. The Buffalo Fishing Assoc. of the Deaf and the Dayton/Indiana Deaf Anglers Club did not affiliate this year, and Houston Bass Club of the Deaf has rejoined after several years of absence. The number of club members of the 25 affiliated clubs is 567. This is the highest number of affiliated club members we have ever had.

The champions and winners of the \$3000 prize were Dale Granger and Kevin Smith of Louisiana. Kevin Smith was the Bassmaster with a total of 11 fish weighing 29.42 pounds for the three days. Kevin out fished his partner by about three ounces. Dale had a total of 11 fish weighing 29.23 pounds. In third place

was a former champion, Ricky Cooper from Georgia with 27.55 pounds. Ricky was fishing with NBAD's president, Alan Rork, and they came in third place. This tournament makes the 9th time a team from Louisiana has won the championship.

The lunker for the three-days tournament was caught by Dale Granger, a fish weighing 5.97 pounds which he caught on the third day. The other 5-pound lunkers for Tuesday and Wednesday were caught by Jeff Maronpot, FL, and Alan Rork, IN, respectively.

A total of 359 fish were weighed-in at 833.05 pounds this year. This is the SECOND highest weigh-in our history. The record stands at 981.85 pounds in 1991 at Kentucky Lake.

The tournament this year makes up for the tournament that was held at Table Rock back in 1978. The total fish caught that year was 57.88 pounds for the three days for ALL anglers! The champions had a total of 8 lbs. 14 ozs. for the three days. Our champions this year brought in more fish than the total amount caught in the 1978 tournament.

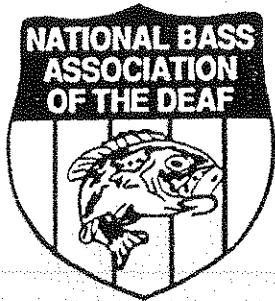

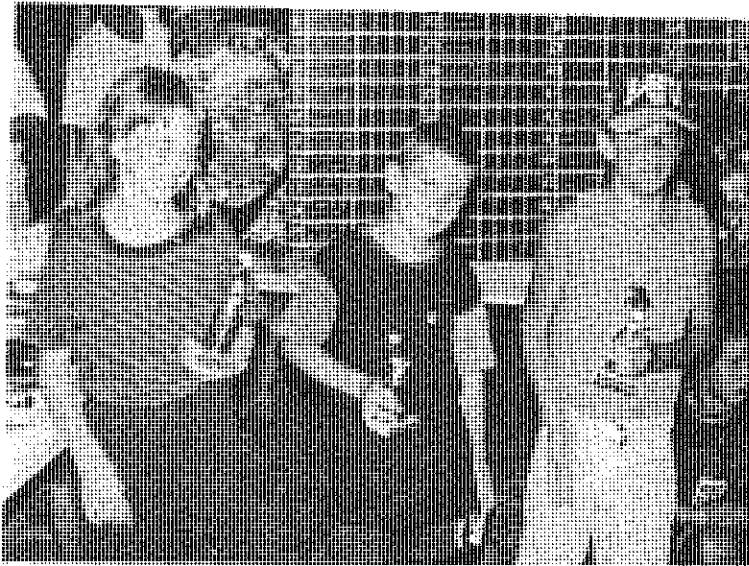

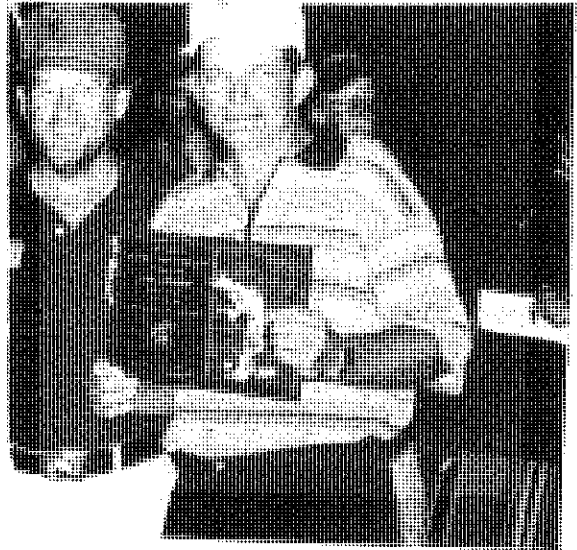

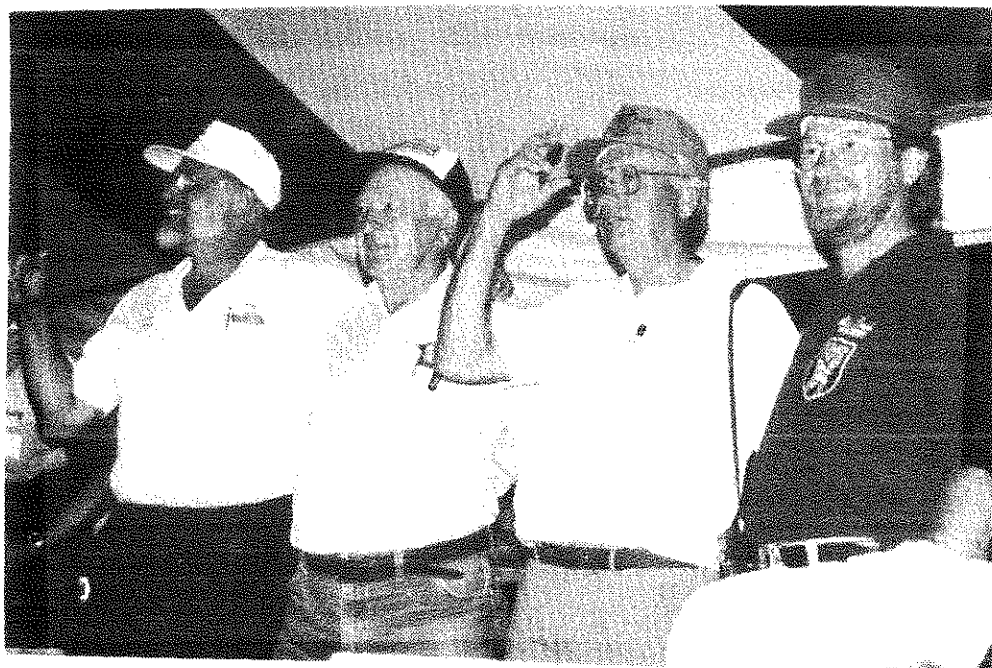
