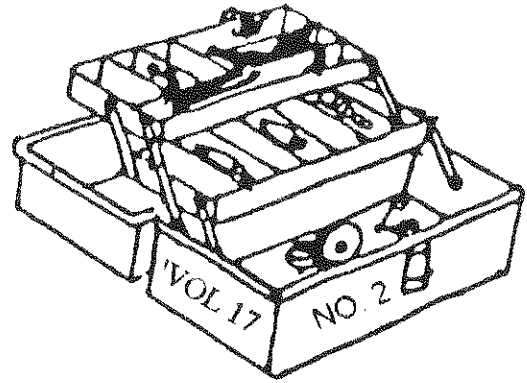

## 20TH ANNUAL NBAD TEAM TOURNAMENT

June 13-15, 1995 at Lake Okeechobee, Florida

This year's team bass tournament was held in Florida at Lake Okeechobee. It was hosted by the National Bass Association of the Deaf, Inc., who sponsors the tournament every ten years. The affiliated local or state clubs sponsor all other tournaments.

General Co-Chairpersons, Wayne O. Mart and Jeffrey

Maronpot, and their committee from Florida plus the NBAD officers did a fine job of teamwork and making this a successful tournament. All of the club representatives also are to be commended for all their help. And it could never have been pulled off without the financial support from our program book

advertisers and boosters. Thanks to everyone!

This year, 126 participants were registered. This was down from last year's 188 anglers at Table Rock in Missouri. This year's anglers came from Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Minnesota, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina,

Ohio, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Wisconsin. We had 31 new anglers (Rookies) this year.

This year a total of 250 fish were caught weighing 4531 pounds. The Bassmaster Award went to Jeff Maronpot (FL) who caught a total of 20.8 pounds of bass. In second place was Paul Harvey (FL) with 16.8 pounds.

### 1995 NBAD Champions



The winners of the \$4000 first prize were Jeffrey Maronpot and Jacob Walters, of Florida. In second place was last year's champions, Kevin Smith and Dale Granger, of Louisiana. In third place was Kenneth Kistner and Dennis Bacon, of Missouri.

The lunker for the three-day tournament was caught

on Thursday by Thomas Davis and weighed 5.64 lbs. This was the biggest fish caught, but it was not as big as most anglers were hoping to catch at Lake Okeechobee, famous for the big bass!

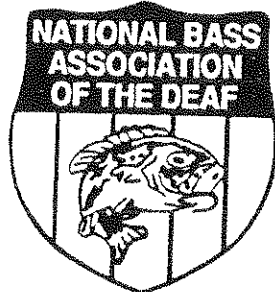
We are now anxiously awaiting for the tournament next June at Truman Lake, Missouri.

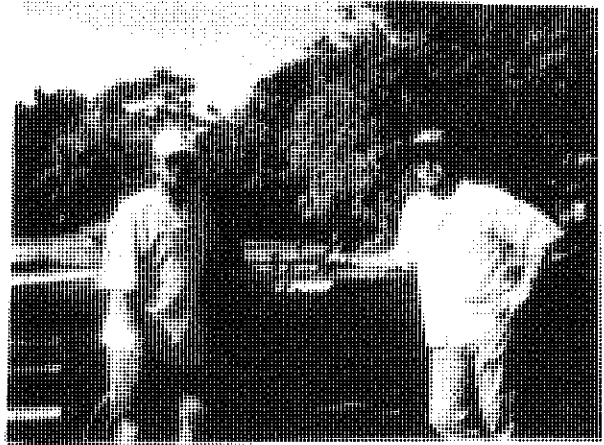
Ranger donated 24 "Ranger" hats. The first, second, and third place winners of the Monday Lunger contest each received one hat of their choice.

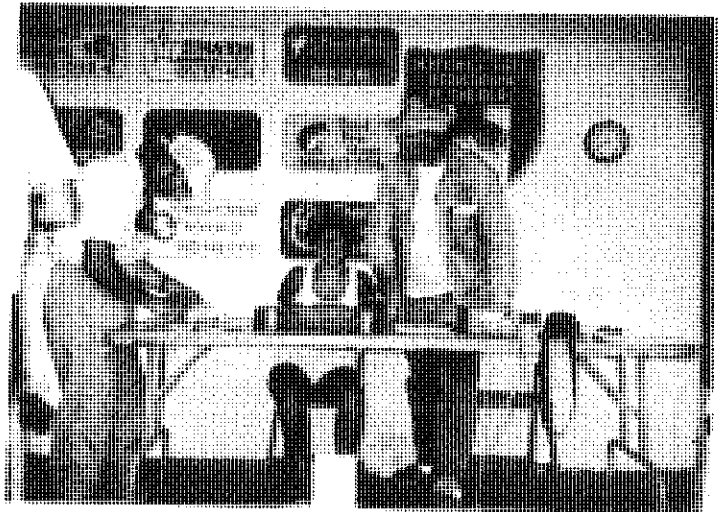
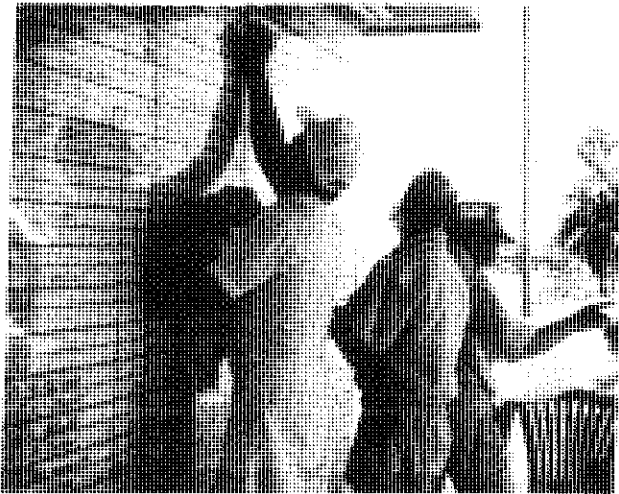
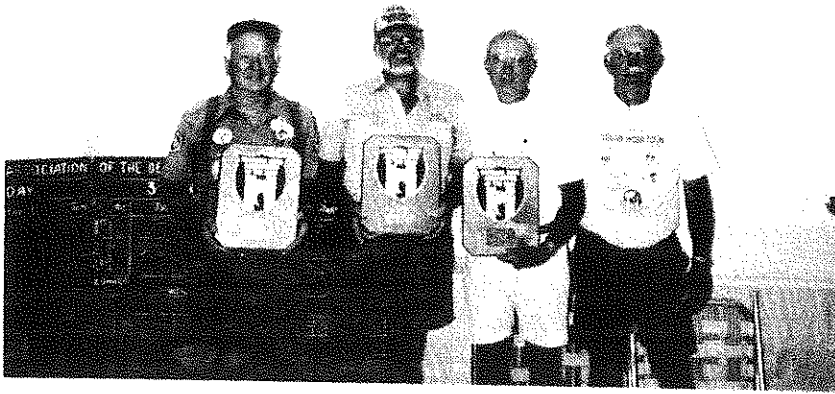

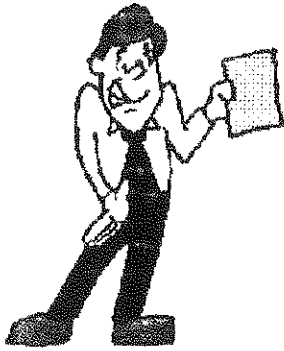
## ROLAND MARTIN TAKES TIME TO GREET NBAD FANS AND ANGLERS

### **Achievement Award:**

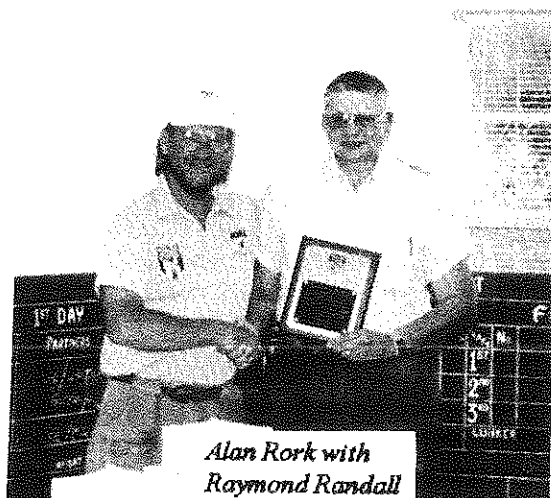
