## SURPRISE!! SCDAC wins 7th place out of 104 teams at NBAD in Kentucky

It was a real surprise for all deaf pro bass anglers from all over the nation when NBAD President Alan Rork of Indiana presented a handsome award to SCDAC President Blake "BFT Loser" Smith and John "Fish head" DuQuin for capturing 7th place winnder during the NBAD's 22nd Tournament at Lake Barkley, Kentucky last June 1997. He also granted Blake two nice trophy plaques for winning a Lunker Bass contest and Rookie of the Year award. He was the first deaf angler from California to win his NBAD awards. There was a huge field of 104 teams (208 deaf anglers) that showed up at the event. It set a new attendance record in the NBAD's history! The old record from lat year was 98 teams (196 anglers). It was hosted by Columbus Deaf Anglers Club of Ohio.

Everybody was very dumbounded to see our SCDAC members using a smell rent boat with 15 horsepower motor in this major deaf bass tournament. Nearly all deafies from all over the nation brought their own \$20,000 pro bass boats which can run up to 70 MPH. On each morning, NBAD officers asked SCDAC guys if they were all right before they started to leave the dock in their rented boat before pro bass boats went zooming out fast and made the water rough which could capsize small boats.

On the 3rd day a bad luck hit our deafies - their marine battery went dead by 9"00 a... It was the most valuable tool they needed to use to search for bass. A healthy battery could run an electronic fish finder a trolling motor. They were very frustrated all day long! No wind or no boat drifting!! By 1:00 p.m. John found a good spot with some rocky structures in the deep channel. While using his small Shimano Calcutta reel loaded with 14 pound test line, Blake casted his plastic lizard out near a boat dock. BINGO! He nailed a nice 4 lbs bass! He quickly changed his plastic lizard to his favorite deep shad plug. Only five minutes after he casted his plug on his 2nd try, it hit a BIG BOMB!! Big bass stuck his lure and went under the boat like a speeding missile. He fought it with his extra care. It turned out to be almost 6 pounder! He was very lucky to hit this one in the right spot at the right timebecause he was due to leave the area in only one hour in order to meet the NBAD's deadline for all deaf fishermen to show up at 3:00 p.m. for official weigh-in. Blake and John were in 35th place on the 1st day of the tournament. then pulled themselves to 12th place. On the last and third day, they advanced to 7th place. Both guys combined in 7 bass totaled 20.67 lbs which was big enough to finish in 7th place and they brought \$160.00 cash!

#### SCDAC's Three Day Trip Scored Limit of Tuna and Yellowtail!!!

We had a wonderful time fishing in two water different territory at Baja. The weather was beauitful and so perfect, even though, the water was so calm.

On the first day, we departed at 1 pm heading south of Baja. The skipper told us to use 40 lbs. line due to the large size of fish. We planned to fish at approximately 115 to 125 milues south of San Diego. We found a spot where a huge school of small yellow fin. Then the four of us brought 6 bonito and small yellowtail.

Next day, there were 17 anglers including 6 deaf) already caught the limit of yellowfin tuna that was total of 170 lbs which weigh about 6 to 12 lbs each fish plus 10 dorado up to 21 lbs. The spot where we fished at 120 miles south of San Diego, California and 25 miles west of Punta Colnett, Baja Mexico.

Then on the third day, we went to San Martin Island around at two in the morning, collecting more mackerel or sardines to use as live baits by fly rigs. The limit of yellowtail was filled up at hot spot called "Ben's Rock" where the famous reef is located which is 5 feet deep water. That ended our fishing trip collecting the yellowtail and tuna. We had to travel 16 hours back home to San Deigo dock.

Good news is I won \$160.00 jackpot for the new record of dorado fish I caught, weighs 21.20 lbs. and 48 inches long. I found the hook/line with sardine in dorado's stomach.

We worked on worms, spinnerbait at points of main lake, but there was no luck. We decided to move to a cove with heavy bushes area. Keith caught two nice bass weighing 2 lbs, using crawdad plug. John only got a one bite; however, he was running out of luck for the day.

Til around 11:30 am, the weather suddenly changed from calm to very hard windy, our boats started losing control. We decided to quit at 2 pm.

We were told by the store that day, two anglers caught 2 limit of 10 bass weighing 55 lbs. including one big bass weighs 12 lbs. All were used on live crawdads.

Some deaf fishermen had already wet their line for practice during the week and sure enough there were plenty of bass in the lake. **Jason Teramae** was the chairperson for the invitational tournament. He was glad that 58 fishermen (29 boats) showed up for the invitational tourney. Some of us stayed at the High Point Inn, Anna Point Inn, and Lakewood Motel.

3:00 pm on Saturday marked the end of the first day tourney. Jason Teramae compiled the weigh in scores that we brought in a total of 53 bass (weight total of 53 lbs. 6 oz.) Bob Seremeth Sr and Bob Corbett won first place with 5 bass weighing 8 lbs. 11.5 oz. The lunker winner for first day went to Sam Harris for bringing in a 4 lbs.14 oz. bass and received a prize worth \$145 in cash.

On Saturday evening at the pavilion, Bobby Seremeth Jr, NBAD 2000 Corbet chairperson, gave us a presentation about the big upcoming tournament during June 12-15, 2000.

Other participants came from New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, and North Carolina.

The rainy weather had started on Saturday night but stopped sometime overnight. We had to work hard on Sunday since the tournament would stop at noon meaning we had to put our rods away at high noon.

Forty-two bass weight total of 55 lbs. 2 oz. was brought in on Sunday. The second day first place team winner crown went to **Don Yanke** and **Dorian Yanke** and they brought in 5 bass weighing 13 lbs. 3.5 oz. The lunker winner for Sunday went to **Don Yanke** for his 5 lbs.12 oz., 21" bass, and received a prize of \$145. The father and son did earn their \$600.00 prize for their hard work trying to bring in those bass.



# ARTICLE VII - TOURNAMENT RULES

The Tournament Rules shall apply to both the one day Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the three days NBAD Tournament. The Monday Lunker Tournament is a single fish tournament and only the largest bass shall be awarded as decided beforehand by the COR. NBAD Tournament is a team tournament where each team will be awarded as decided beforehand by the COR. The Tournament Rules shall be printed with the tournament announced flyers and inside each souvenir book every year.

Section 1 – SPORTSMANSHIP: Any contestant who displays poor sportsmanship, violates any of the contest rules or violates the state fishing laws shall be promptly disqualify. Intoxication on the part of any contestant will not be tolerated and will result in disqualification. Any violation will result in a two (2) year suspension. IF a second offense, a life time suspension shall be imposed.

Section 2 - CLUB SHIRT: Every member who participates the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament is encouraged to wear club's name on his shirt.

Section 3 - FISH: Black bass (largemouth, smallmouth, and spotted bass) may be scored only

Section 4 -- PARTICIPANTS AND ELIGIBILITY: Participant in the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament is open to any deaf or hard of hearing and no discrimination by sex or race. Changing of boat partner shall not be allowed unless by act of God. Participant shall be 18 year of age or older.

Section 5 – PARTNER IN TEAM TOURNAMENT: The Host Club and NBAD are not responsibility for the pairing the partners. Boat partners will be arrange by all contestants under mutual agreement. A team of two contestants will fish together throughout the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament or the NBAD Tournament. See special handicapped rule Section 6. No rotation of boat partners will take place for any given reason once their names are registered with NBAD. In case of emergency, illness or serious injury should any one members of the team be forced to leave the NBAD Tournament, the other will either be automatically dropped out or be accompanied by an appointed observer (see Rule #15 or replacing fisherman rule #21), to preserve order and harmony in all NBAD Tournament where arrangement of boat partner is concerned. Tournament officials reserve the right to make necessary changes unless otherwise agreed Selection of water routes and fishing spots shall be equally shared by each two man team. Fair shares in expenses involving and use of the boat is required of every boat partner. Non boaters (partner) shall not be liable for expense involving and use of the boat is required of every boat partner. Non boaters (partner) shall not be liable for expense involving are the breakdowns on the equipment including a boat, itself during the NBAD Tournament. The boat owner should prepare and be responsibility on his or her boat.

Section 6 – SPECIAL HANDICAPPED PARTICIPATION: Two team can fish out of a platoon boat. Each team must have one healthy person and one handicapped person. Rule # Section 5 shall apply as if it is one team and both teams must be mutual when sharing the responsible of a platoon. There shall be one Host committee observer for each two team boat.

Section 7 – TACKLE AND EQUIPMENT: Artificial lures shall be used during the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament. Only casting, spincasting, or spinning rods and reels will be allowed. Only one line may be in the water at any time. Additional rigged rods will be permitted in the boat as substitutes. Use of 7 1/2 fool flip rod is permitted. Motor trolling with gas-powered outboard engines is prohibited. Deptinder, thermometers, etc., which are not in violation of state laws may be used.

Section 8 – FISHING WATERS: All water in the lake where the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament are held, may be fished. No fishing will be permitted within 50 yards of another contestant whose boat tied down or anchored, and within 50 yards of the headquarters. Bank fishing is prohibited. Contestant(s) may rent/boats.

Section 9 – LAUNCHING TIME: Issuance of check-in cards will be conducted at the boat dock area at a designated time. No time limit for checkout and may check out at your discretion. Tournament officials must inspect your boat before you leave at first check-out. Tournament participants must arrive with check-in card and fish for the weight-in before designated time; if late, will be disqualified for that one particular day. Contestant may return to dock for linch or rest but can not report for weight-in until at a designated for each day. Dues to unexpected weather condition, NBAD Executive Members may alternate the launch and weight-in time. Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament shall be on a Monday before Father day and the time shall be from 6:00 A.M. until 11:00 A.M. The NBAD Tournament shall be on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, before Father Day in June. The time of the NBAD Tournament shall begin at 6:00 A.M. and conclude at 3:00 P. M. each day unless state regulations are different from NBAD.

# ARTICLE VII – TOURNAMENT RULES

Section 10 – SCORING: Scoring will be based on the weigh-in pounds and ounces or pounds with two placed decimals. The minimum length shall be 12 inches with mouth closed or the legal minimum length of the NBAD Tournament lake. The maximum number of bass shall be 10 bass per person per day or the legal limit of the NBAD Tournament lake. [The new five basses per person will go in effect during the year of 2000]. NBAD will deduct two ounces (2 oz) for each dead bass brought in for weight-in by cach participant.

Section 11 — TIES: In the even of a tie where the weigh, length, and girth of a fish are equal, all prizes shall be divided equally and additional trophics, if necessary, shall be awarded.

Section 12 - LIFE JACKETS: Contestant must wear life jackets while gasoline powered boats are in

use.

Section 13 — REGISTRATION: The date, time, and place or registration will be sent out well in advance to persons who are interested in entering the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament. All contestants must register at headquarters. Those who arrive late are still welcome they must register before entering the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament. Meeting time shall be announced at the headquarters. Tournament hours shall be announced at the General Meeting.

Section 14 - RULES CHANGES: Interpretation of the NBAD Tournament Rules shall be the responsibility of the NBAD Vice President with approval of the NBAD Executive Board. Final decision in all matter shall be made by the NBAD Officers with the approval of the Executive Board.

Section 15 -- MONDAY LUNKER TOURNAMENT: There shall be two participants per boat with no exception and each participant must be registered to fish in the NBAD Tournament. See rule Section 6 for special handicapped.

Section 16 – SINGLE ENTREE NUMBER ENTRIES: If a participant is the last contest a single entree and fishes alone, he or she will earn 1 1/2 times his or her catches. The single fisherman in the NBAD Tournament must be the General Chairman of NBAD officers (see rule Section 5 for boat partner).

Section 17 – SAFETY: To ensure the safety of all contestants, no contestant shall be allowed to compete alone in a boat at any Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament or NBAD Tournament. In case of a contestant who, after pairing all of the boat partner in the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament, finds him or her without a registered contestant as a boat partner shall immediately be assigned one of several appointed observers by the tournament officials. The observer, as boat partner, shall know the NBAD Tournament Rules, be permitted to operate the boats and assist the contestant in any way (see rule #14).

Section 18 — FISHING GUIDE: There shall be no fishing with a guide for hire within fourteen(14) days prior the first day of the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament. Upon evidence of fishing with a guide, the contestant will be disqualified for the entire NBAD Tournament.

Section 19 - NO FISHING PRACTICE: There shall be no fishing during the General Meeting

Section 20 - KILL SWITCH: To ensures the safety of all contestants, the boat operating with electrical ignition shall be required to have a kill switch in the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament and it must be engaged while boat is moving.

Section 21 – BOAT NUMBERS: Participating boats must have numbered stickers, issued by the NBAD officials at the registering. Numbered stickers must be placed on each side of the outboard in a clean view. Numbers from 1 to 10 are reserved for the NBAD officers and host committee officials to be recognized. It is important to keep your number on or face some difficulties on securing another numeral.

Section 22 - REASON FOR LEAVING: That before the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NI Tournament a replacing fisherman must pay his/her full tournament fee before the NBAD Tournament.

Section 23 - C.B. Radio: Participant in the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament shall not use a C.B. radio and shall disqualify and be rejected from that tournament.

Section 24 - DISQUALIFIED: A contestant who is disqualified for any of the three days can weight his fish in case his reason of disqualification(s) is appealed.

Section 25 - BOAT REQUIREMENT: Every boat in the Monday NBAD Lunker Tournament and the NBAD Tournament must have the following items: kill switch, safety cushions, life jackets, first aid, fire extinguisher, state fishing license, and horn and/or whistle.
