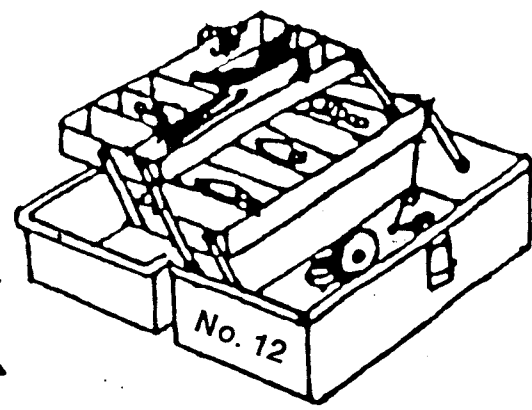

## New Record! 128 Anglers at Lake Barkley

The 14th Annual NBAD Team Tournament was hosted by the Wisconsin Deaf Sport Club at Prizer Point Resort at Lake Barkley at Cadiz, Kentucky on June 13, 14, 15, 1989. The new attendance record was established by 128 bass anglers who participated in the tournament. The new record broke a previous record of 124 set at Truman Lake at Clinton, Missouri in 1988 hosted by Olathe Bass Club of the Deaf.

It is noted that the Wisconsin Deaf Sport Club has broken the attendance record twice. One was in 1986 at Bull Shoal Lake in Arkansas and 1989 at Lake Barkley.

In history of NBAD, the attendance record has been broken for four (4) straight years since 1985. It started to break the record with 90 at Bull Shoal Lake in Arkansas in 1986, 118 at Kentucky Lake in 1987, 124 at Truman Lake in Missouri in 1988 and 128 in 1989.

In 1976 when the National Bass Association of the Deaf was first organized, it had an attendance of 62 bass anglers participated in the first annual tournament. The 1988 and 1989 records have doubled that number of 1976!

In 1982 and 1983, the NBAD

had the lowest attendance record of 56 anglers competing at Lake Eufaula in Alabama and Oklahoma respectively.

## N.C. Team Won 14th Tournament Championship

A team of Michael D. Branch and James G. Greenwood from North Carolina won the team championship in the 14th Annual NBAD Team Tournament held at Lake Barkley at Cadiz, Kentucky on June 13, 14, 15, 1989. They caught 17 bass together which weighed in at total 40.02 pounds to win first place.

Mike Branch brought in 12 bass weighing at 27.33 pounds that won him the bassmaster award while his partner got 7 bass with 12.69 pounds.

It was the first time for a North Carolina team to win the championship since 1976.

Two years ago at Kentucky Lake a team of Billy Bledsoe and Randy Poteat from North Carolina would have first won the championship if it had not been for disqualification.

Second place was conquered by another North Carolina team of Roger Stewart and Cecil Koonce who both caught total weight of bass at 39.14 pounds.

The Louisiana team of Eddie Wood and Medford Magill took third place with 32.66 pounds

of bass.

The largest luncker of the tournament was 6.04 pound caught by Jack A. Zook from Indiana.

Those lucky team winners from first place to 21st places received cash prizes.

## New Record for Total Bass and Weight

The heavy and light rain storms hit Lake Barkley frequently during the 14th Annual tournament which will always be remembered by the anglers as well as the visitors. The storms flattened some camp tents and made mattresses wet-soaked and forced campers move to another site or seek to get room in nearby motel.

In spite of inclement weather the determined anglers still managed to catch bass as many as they could which produced a new record for number of bass and weight of bass caught. They brought home 452 bass which weighed in at 674.65 pounds in three days.

The new record broke the previous record of 322 bass and total weight of 461.19 pounds caught in 1983 at Lake Eufaula in Oklahoma.

## President Speaks

Thanks to General Chairman George Evans and committees for their hard work and big success in the 14th Annual NBAD Team Tournament which produced some new records; 128 anglers participated who caught 452 basses weighing in total 672.56 pounds, and tied a record of 18 bass clubs affiliated with NBAD. We will never forget about Lake Barkley where we have had difficult time with lots of rain but we still caught many bass and have had great fun.

The National Fraternal Society of the Deaf will give their special feat award of \$500.00 to any lucky NFSD fisherman who catches a 10 pounds or heavier black bass.

If any bass club or fishing club does not affiliate with NBAD, the National Fraternal Society of the Deaf will not give their special feat award of \$500.00 to lucky NFSD fisherman who catches a 10 pounds or heavier black bass.

NBAD is encouraging for all affiliated bass clubs to have their bass tournaments, which is helping to make a profit and experience.

Also, NBAD encourages the state bass club to help to establish some local bass clubs, if there are large members. In the season of fall, state bass club officers have host the classic tournament for only members from all local bass clubs.

The local bass club hosts a contest tournament every month for seven (7) months. By participating in contest tournament for at least four times, a member is be qualified for classic tournament.

Each contestant must pay ten dollars at headquarter. The two dollars (\$2.00) will deducted from ten dollars (\$10.00) contest tournament fee to state bass club for

classic tournament fund every month. The prize will be larger than one state or local bass club. The local bass may use the 7 months plan contest (breakdown system for the winning point).

NBAD is a qualified organization for Internal Revenue Service. You donate the amount of money and the contribution is deductible on Schedule A (Form 1040) if you itemize your deductions. Dues paid are not deductible.

## First Woman Won Bass Lunker Contest

On Monday, June 12, 1989, the bass lunker contest took place at Lake Barkley at Cadiz, Kentucky, and about over 100 anglers participated in that event.

The outcome of the event surprised everybody. It was Elen R. Zook from Indiana who won first place with her catch of 5.34 pound bass on her first venture. She is the first woman to win the lunker award event in NBAD's history.

Second place went to Roger Stewart from North Carolina with 3.88 pounds while Thomas McClintock of Missouri took third place with 3.66 pounds.

## NBAD Appreciates Service Given By Marina Owner

The meeting of Council of Representatives was held at the Prizer Point Marina picnic shelter on June 11, 1989.

Charles E. Marsh, Jr., Executive Board member, announced that he has participated in every tournament for 14 years. 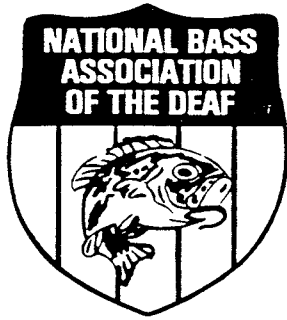

# TOPICS OF MEETING

## No Refund after Deadline! Effective in 1990

The NBAD confusedly had a problem regarding refund of entry fee claim by entrant at Lake Barkley in Kentucky last summer.

As a result of that problem the Council of Representatives voted to reject refund of entry fee after deadline unanimously. The deadline will be effective in 1990.

Anglers, please remember the new rule!!

## Change of Treas. - Secretary into 2 Offices

In the morning of June 11, 1989, the meeting of NBAD Executive Board was held at Prizer Point Marina & Resort at Lake Barkley in Kentucky.

They voted to recommend that office of Secretary-Treasurer be separated into 2 offices.

Later in evening on that day, the Council of Representatives voted to approve the separation of Secretary-Treasurer into two offices un-animously. The new offices became official and effective on that day before an election of officers next day.

In history of NBAD, it was originally begun with four offices in 1976; President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. In 1979, the offices of Treasurer and Secretary were joined into one office of Secretary-Treasurer and it has continued for ten (10) years until 1989. Once in 1980, they proposed to separate the combined office and it failed.

## NBAD Purchases Digital Weight Scale

It was learned from a source that the old minutes of the meeting of 1977 and 1979 indicated members of NBAD voted to buy a weight scale, but however, the action did not materialize for ten years!

Until 1988, at Truman Lake in Missouri, the Executive Board and Council of Representatives proposed to purchase a scale again, but it was not acted upon till 1989!

The NBAD finally bought a two year-old digital weight scale from Olathe Bass Club of the Deaf on June 11, 1989 for the amount of \$260.13 after the board and representatives voted on approval of sale of scale after it was displayed and demonstrated how it worked. For the first time since 1976, the NBAD has the scale of its own and used it during the tournament at Lake Barkley last summer.

## Change of 1993 Site

Before the meeting of Council of Representatives was adjourned at Prizer Point Marina picnic shelter on June 11, 1989, Winfred Larkin from Indiana, who is a General Chairman of 18th Annual NBAD Team Tournament in 1993, has announced that he considers about the move of annual tournament from Kentucky Lake (first choice) to West Point Lake in Georgia.

Winfred will let you know more information about the move in near future.

## Election of Officers for 1989-1991

On June 12, 1989, Monday afternoon, the General Assembly meeting was called to order by President Alan Rork at Prizer Point Marina Picnic Shelter at Lake Barkley at Rockcastle, Ky. An election of officers took place.

Alan D. Rork from Indiana was nominated for President. He won it by acclamation as re-elected President.

Four candidates ran for an office of Vice-President; two ran for Secretary and two for Treasurer, and one for Publicity Director.

ionship team if less than 100 entries; \$2500 if over 100 entries; \$3000 if over 150 entries. The WDA has already deposited amount of \$1500 to NBAD in escrow which exceeds its requirement by \$900! That means more cash for daily prizes. What a generous club!

## Bid for Tournament is \$600.00 Effective in 1993

On June 13, 1987, the meeting of Council of Representatives was held at Sportsman's Camping Resort at Kentucky Lake, the members voted to amend the NBAD By-Laws by increasing the fee of \$330 to \$600.00 for a host club to bid for annual tournament. It will be in effect in 1993.

(Excerpts from NBAD By-Laws)  
Article VII  
Tournament Hosts  
Section 2

- (a) Bids are to be made at the annual meeting of the NBAD. Voting on bids shall be conducted immediately following the annual election of officers.
- (b) While bids will be accepted for the purposes of hosting a tournament without limit as to how many years in advance, two (2) years after the present tournament is in progress must be accompanied by a letter of acceptance from the marina management se-

lected as the site of the tournament.

- (e) Bids must be accompanied by the club's check for \$600.00 dollars to be held in escrow to guarantee that the club will follow through with its bid for the tournament. This deposit will not be refunded. The \$600 dollars will become the daily prize.

## Special Prizes for Setting New Record

On June 20, 1982 the Council of Representatives approved the plan of awarding \$200.00 with a plaque to a winner who breaks the NBAD lunker record starting in 1983.

It is understood that the NBAD will pay the cost and cash prize.

On June 13, 1987, they voted to set up a special prize fund for a new bassmaster record and team championship record, but it was on pending till 1988.

On June 12, 1988, the meeting of Council of Representatives was held at Bucksaw Resort Point shelter at Truman Lake in Missouri and the members voted to raise entry fee from \$35.00 to \$50.00 with a late penalty fee of \$10.00 instead of \$5.00. Effective in 1989.

Thus the NBAD will use the late penalty fees for special prize fund for breaking lunker, bassmaster and team championship records.

An angler who breaks lunker record will receive a plaque with cash prize. Other new breaking records by anglers will receive cash prizes.

The NBAD reports that it already has a special prize

fund in treasury.

There is a list of cash prizes for each record category shown below:

## Sportsmanship and Bassmaster Named after Founders

The meeting of Council of Representatives was held on June 13, 1987 at Sportsman's Safari Camping Resort at Lake Kentucky at Benton, Ky. They voted that NBAD pays for inscription on bassmaster trophy in honor of the name of Robert Southwell, who is one of founders of the National Bass Association of the Deaf.

One year later, on June 12, 1988, at Harry Truman Reservoir in Missouri, the Council of Representatives voted to have sportsmanship trophy be inscribed in honor of the name of Anthony Mowad.

On June 12, 1989, Charles E. Marsh, Jr., Executive Board, gave a short speech about the sportsmanship and bassmaster awards. He said it was appropriate to name awards in honor of the founders of the National Bass Association of the Deaf.

# TOPICS OF MEETING

## Rookies Receive Free Patches at Every Tournament

The Publicity Director recently browsed the minutes of meeting of Council of Representatives on June 13, 1987 at Benton, Kentucky and noticed the motion was moved that NBAD gives free patches to rookies who participate in annual tournament. That was not necessary for them to do.

The NBAD enacted the By-Laws in 1978 and one of the rules states that a new member will receive a free patch. It has been in effect ever since.

(Excerpts from NBAD By-Laws)  
Article VI - Dues  
Section 1

(b) NBAD will be given the free patch only to new "Rookie" angler the participant in the NBAD tournament. Additional patches may be purchased from the NBAD at cost.

## Established Hall of Fame

On June 20, 1982, the first idea of setting up a HALL OF FAME was created at the meeting of Council of Representatives at Lake Eufaula in Alabama. They voted that the NBAD officers start the HALL OF FAME project. However, the action was not materialized until June 1984.

The meeting of Council of Representatives was held at Sportsman Safari Campgrounds at Benton, Kentucky on June 17, 1984 where they voted to establish HALL OF FAME again for deaf anglers only.

They set up the rules for a candidate to meet requirement of qualifying to be eligible.

To be eligible, a candidate must have achievement in the areas of founder, fishermen with 10 straight years of attendance, ex-officer with 5 years of service within 10 years, ex-chairman and local club hosting twice in 10 years.

## First Inductees Introduced into Hall of Fame

The Tenth Annual NBAD Team Tournament and Tenth Annual Anniversary Celebration was hosted by National Bass Association of the Deaf Officers at Toledo Bend Reservoir at Hemphill, Texas on June 11, 12, 13, 1985.

When asked through a sign-language interpreter what his favorite part of the tournament has been, Rork signed, "More fishermen. People have come from nationwide to fish for bass, fellowship, friendship, leadership and sportsmanship."

Robbie Isonhood, owner and operator of the marina and resort, said that he had never heard of the Bass Association for the Deaf until he was approached by its representatives earlier this year to host the tournament.

"We did two things to get ready for this," Isonhood said. "One, we hired an in-

terpreter and two, we told our regular customers to stay away for this week, that everything was reserved for these people."

Isonhood noted that the tourney participants occupy all of his 80 campsites and four cottages. In addition, some are in Eddyville, Princeton, Cadiz and Eddy Creek.

David Snow, who is acting as the interpreter this week for the deaf, said that so far there have been no major communication problems, however, many times the campers resort to pencil and paper to communicate with others.

Snow was on hand to help direct the participants to their campsites and help them register.

"The bad thing," Snow said, "is I don't know anything about fishing."

"This is the first time I

have done this (interpreted for the deaf) on this large of a scale, but I enjoy it -- it's like a hobby of mine," Snow said.

Isonhood described the tournament group "without question the best group we've had in eight years."

When asked if he has learned any sign language during the course of the week, the owner said, "I can say thank-you, your welcome and gasoline."

Isonhood noted that the most difficult part of the event was getting everyone registered.

"Now, this is the fun part," he said as he watched the campers sign excitedly to one another inside the marina's main facility.

"I knew it (tournament) would be great for the community for us to host one," Isonhood said.

"We had this thing set up like a fine Swiss watch," he said. "It has all gone great."
