

17th Annual NBAD Team Tournament Will be Sponsored by Little Rock Bass Anglers of the Deaf, Inc. at Lake Ouachita in Arkansas on June 16, 17, 18, 1992

The 17th Annual NBAD Team Tournament will be held at Lake Ouachita at Mount Ida, Arkansas on June 16, 17, 18, 1992.

The headquarter site will be located at Mountain Harbor Resort about 2 miles off U.S. Highway 270.

The Little Rock Bass Anglers of the Deaf, Inc. will sponsor the tournament under chairmanship of William O. Schwall and his committee.

The first place team winner will be guaranteed to receive \$2,000.00.

This will be the second

time for Arkansas to have a NBAD team tournament. The first one was held at Bull Shoals Lake in 1986 sponsored by Wisconsin Deaf Sports Club.

Mountain Harbor Resort is located about 25 miles west of Hot Springs National Park, Arkansas, just off U.S. Highway 270.

There are attractions, zoo, shopping, history, museums, bus tours, aquarium, view from Mountain Tower and sightseeing adventures.

The National Bass Association of the Deaf reports that there are 483 participants competed in the annual NBAD team tournaments since 1976. They represented 25 states and Canada.



Motion VIII. Little Rock Bass Anglers of the Deaf, Inc. made a motion the Host shall pay the lodging expenses in half for the officers of N.B.A.D. instead of the full single rate. Ronald Stanford second. Passed by 2/3.

Motion IX. Olathe Bass Club of the Deaf made a proposal that the minimum length shall be 15 inches. Effective in 1992 to be counted during N.B.A.D. Team Tournament for 3 days. Out of order.

Motion X. Missouri Deaf Bass Anglers made a proposal that Quota \$2.00 fee shall change to Registration fee. Out of order.

Motion XI. Missouri Deaf Bass Anglers made a proposal that we shall have 5 miles radius from the marina. William Schwall second. Elen Zook (Loren Alderman) amends to maximum 5 miles marina. Vote on Elen Zook's amends. Passed. Vote on Main motion. Passed.

Motion XII. Randy Poteat made a motion to request that N.B.A.D. to please enforce its own rule of starting at 5:00 A.M. on the button and check in at 3:00 P.M. Regardless of the weather. No one second.

Motion XIII. Dayton Deaf Anglers Club proposed that anyone who pays entry fee and does not show up, will have their program book and grab gift, mailed to him or her. Ronald Stanford second. Passed.

Motion XIV. Dayton Deaf Angiers Club made a proposal to have winners Plaque - only the Champion's name, date and year on name plate. N.B.A.D. will bring back the Winners Plaque every year for display. Danny Cochran second. Passed.

Motion W. Dayton Deaf Anglers Club made a proposal to nave non-participants pay \$1.00 for registration card, the reason is that they will know who they are and will be color coded from fishermen registrations which are white. Out of order.

Vice President Martin H. Miller ask you to revise items.

The meeting of June 20, 1982 Johnny Scott (Tom Rogers) moved that the host club buy 2 golf shirts with the words on the back "N.B.A.D. Team Championship" starting 1983. Passed.


Kester's father was born deaf. His

Challengers Keep Inching Closer To 60-Year-Old Largemouth Record

California's Lake Castaic just keeps popping out bigger and bigger largemouth bass. No one could argue if the city fathers placed a "Bass Capital of the World" sign at Castaic's town limits.

In a seven-day span last March, Mike Arujo caught a 21 lb 12 oz largemouth and Bob Crupi captured and released a lunker weighing 22.01 lb while fishing on the famed bass lake.

These are the two biggest largemouth bass catches ever submitted to IGFA for line class recognition. George W. Perry's 22 lb 4 oz alltackle record bass taken from Georgia's Montgomery Lake in 1932 was given recognition by Field & Stream magazine before the publication turned its freshwater records over to IGFA.

Arujo's bass caught on March 5, has been submitted in the 12-lb line class category.

Crupi's monster fish, the first largemouth documented over 22 lb in nearly 60 years, was hooked on March 12. It has been submitted for the 20-lb line class record, currently held by Dan Kadota, and also taken from Lake Castaic.

A nearby fisherman Jeff Ackerman not only saw Crupi boat the bass; he also saw him return and release it a couple of hours later near the very spot he caught it.

"It was a chance of a lifetime for me to see that," said Ackerman, a movie set prop man in Hollywood. "I didn't realize how big it was until he came back. Most guys, after weighing it and realizing it was a record, would have kept it and mounted it. I thought it was great that he came back and released it."

To anyone's knowledge, Crupi's fish is the first over 22 pounds to have its picture taken. Perry never photographed his fish; he had it for dinner.

Crupi weighed and measured his bass in front of witnesses Veronica DeGeorge and Noelle Riach at Castaic Hardware, and had it photographed by the owner of the local Radio Shack store. Crupi's fish was not approved as the California state record (granted to Arujo) because it was not examined by a Department of Fish and Game biologist.

Arujo was critical of the circumstances surrounding Crupi's catch.

"I don't know why anyone who caught a fish that big would release it," said Arujo of Santa Monica.

Crupi, a Los Angeles Police Department motorcycle cop, said he used to mount his big catches before he became preservation-minded as he is now. Crupi has many mounts of big fish, including four different versions of a 21 lb largemouth he caught in March 1990 for the IGFA 12-lb line class record. He claims that is enough for his wall. He has been practicing catch-and-release since the early 1980s, he said.

"Before I even weighed that fish, I knew that as healthy as she was, I was going to release her. I felt that with all the big fish coming out of Castaic (four over 21 lb in the last year), if we don't keep this fish in with the gene pool of these other world-class fish, then we'll be in

trouble."

Kadota, the king of Lake Castaic bass fishermen with 92 over 10 pounds, said he knows Crupi, trusts him completely, and would never doubt his integrity.

Arujo, 31, is a big game fishing enthusiast who works summers on a sports boat out of Santa Monica. He bass fishes with artificial lures while Crupi uses live crawdads for bait.

Arujo's bass measured 28 1/2 inches long and 26 1/2 in girth compared to Crupi's bass that was 29 1/2 inches long and 27 1/2 inches in girth.

Crupi, who can see part of the lake from his home a mile away, said, "The next all-tackle world record largemouth is going to come from Lake Castaic. And, I know where she is."

IGFA has begun investigating and processing the two record applications and will render a decision within 90 days. Three of the current line class records for largemouth bass are held by Lake Castaic fishermen. The last four largemouth winners in IGFA's annual fishing contest came from the same lake. When Your Fish Swallows the Hook, It Can Still Survive

There was no thought of science as the angler sped towards the diving birds. Only that the activity held promise of the last chance of the day to have fresh fish for supper. The birds were working a narrow cut with current rushing into the ship channel.

Action came on the first cast. A nice flounder. Then another. Then a small speck. The fish was avid, and had swallowed the hook. It measured less than 12 inches, so the hook was carefully removed from the throat and the fish released. The fish went upside down, probably dead.

One more try, and another avid speck. This one made the measure and joined the flounders on ice. The next was under sized and had also swallowed the hook.

Then came a thought. If the fish would probably die from having the single hook removed, why not try cutting the leader and leaving the hook in the fish? This was done, the fish carefully measured at 11 3/4 inches, tag No. L504639 inserted, and the fish returned to the water.

The angler thought it was a wasted tag, because the fish looked like it couldn't make it, but the current quickly carried it out of netting range.

Twenty-three days later Steve was on his way home in a rented skiff. His first trip in a long time. At least if he hadn't caught any fish, he was doing the two off-duty policemen some good. Their motor had failed,

and Steve was towing them back to the dock. In appreciation he was given some fish and fishing advice. The advice included location, baits and techniques. The kind of information one usually takes with a grain of salt, but this was believable because it was offered in thanks for a tow home.

That evening Steve noticed the tag on one of the specks as he was filleting the catch of the day. The next morning he called LSU Sea Grant to report the tag return. The report was FAXed to the tagging program chairman in New Orleans.

The matchup on the release was displayed on the computer.

Bingo! It was that sure-to-die fish. What happened? Would it have survived longer? Where was the hook? How had it grown 1/2 inch? An anxious wait until late in the afternoon when Steve answered the phone. The carcass had been put outside in a plastic bag for the trash pick up. "Beyond the call of duty" nearby GCCA members rushed over to recover the bag, put the partially decomposed fish on ice, and deliver the fish for autopsy.

The next day the remains were delivered to the staff at the Aquarium of the Americas. Examination showed no scars in the throat where the hook penetrated. What was left of the hook was found in the stomach. Half of the hook had broken off and was gone. The remaining part of the break looked as if the hook had been made brittle, possibly by stomach acids.

The barb and half of the bend had penetrated the stomach wall, and was in the body cavity. A substantial amount of heavy tissue had already been built around the barb—the beginning of the "soft pearl" that LSU Coastal Fishery Institute biologists report finding in many fish.

The filleted carcass measured 12 1/4 inches. Unanswered is whether the fish grew from capture to capture, or if the carcass stretched when the fish relaxed—a phenomena observed by Texas biologists.

The conclusion of the aquarium experts was that the fish would have survived the first capture. One thing is certain. From now on I'm giving the hook to any released fish that swallows it.—MAUMUS CLAVERIE.

21 States Representing 156 Anglers Set New Record

For the first time in 16 years since 1976, the NBAD had more than 20 states to represent 156 participants at the 16th Annual Team Tournament at Kentucky Lake at Benton, Ky. on June 11, 12, 13, 1991.

The new 21-state record eliminated the previous of 18 set in 1989 at Lake Bark-ley in Kentucky.

46 Rookies Set New Record at Kentucky Lake

The old record of 43 rookies set at Kentucky Lake in 1987 was broken by a new record of 46 who competed at the same lake on June 11, 12, 13, 1991.

They came from 12 different states to establish the new record. The largest group of rookies represented Ohio - 17.

New Record: 32 Anglers Caught 10 lbs. & Over for 3 Days

32 bass anglers brought and registered their catches totaling 10 pounds and over for three days at Kentucky Lake on June 11, 12, 13, 1991. The new record wiped out the old record of 19 set in 1983 at Lake Eufaula in Okla., in 1989 at Lake Barkley in Ky. and in 1990 at Lake Sam Rayburn in Texas.

New Record: 29 Teams Caught 10 lbs. & Over in One Day

29 teams also set another new record for catching 10 pounds and over in one day in NBAD history at Kentucky Lake in June 1991. The new record erased the previous record of 18 set in 1989 at Lake Barkley in Kentucky.

New Record: 33 Teams Caught 10 lbs. & Over for 3 Days

The new record of 33 teams caught 10 lbs. and over for three days was established at Kentucky Lake on June 13, 1991. It broke the previous record of 27 set in 1989 at Lake Barkley in Kentucky.

73 Per cent of 483 Participants Caught Bass at Tournaments Since 1976

The NBAD acknowledges that 73 per cent of 483 participants have caught bass at tournaments since 1976.

It shows that there are 352 anglers caught bass and 131 ones did not catch any bass.

The true fact of this figure is based on the "LIST OF ANGLERS WHO PARTICIPATED IN TOURNAMENTS FROM 1976 TO 1991" on page 31 and "TOTAL WEIGHT OF BASS CAUGHT BY ANGLERS FROM 1976 TO 1991" on page 39 of this issue.


