

### Medford Magill and Ed Wood Win 9th NBAD Team Championship

Sportsmanship and fellowship were the passwords to all NBAD anglers at the Ninth Annual National Bass Association of the Deaf Team Tournament on June 19, 20, and 21 at Kentucky Lake. Eddie Wood and Medford Magill of Louisiana won NBAD's ninth title with the total of 23 lbs. and 15 ozs. It was Eddie's first and Magill's second championship of the NBAD tournaments.

There were eighty-two anglers including three women and their families from many parts of the United States.

Indiana Bass Association of the Deaf which hosted the tournament with Jack Zook as Chairman, did a heck of a good job! A good job for planning, setting up and making sure that everyone met their needs. Jack Zook deserves our praise for breaking the old record of eighty fishermen in 1978 by adding two more to make it eighty-two.

NBAD President Charles Marsh of Olathe, Kansas, who is serving his fifth year, expressed his thoughts about the tournament. He said that besides the competition, that association made it possible for the deaf to gather together and compete. Most of us know each other even though we live hundreds of miles apart. It is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to make friends with whom we have the same interest - fishing.

Stressing that this is a real family activity, Marsh explained that most of the men brought their families to the tournament. It was a nice opportunity for hearing children of deaf parents to get together. It gives them something in common. He also said that the tournament gave the guys a chance to share fishing secrets and experiences.

Harry Trahan and Gene Amons, both of Monroe, Louisiana, are two fishermen who have never missed any of NBAD Tournaments since it was founded in 1976. Trahan has won three championships and Amons has won four. Trahan said that he kept coming back because it was fun to see people he saw only once a year and the competition was always good. Amons felt that the championship was nice but it was not what made the event worthwhile. It depended on whether the lake itself was any good.

President Marsh is expecting around one hundred fishing enthusiasts in the event's tenth anniversary which will be held at Toledo Bend, Texas next June 11, 12, 13, 1985. The headquarters will be at Frontier Parks, Hemphill, Texas.


