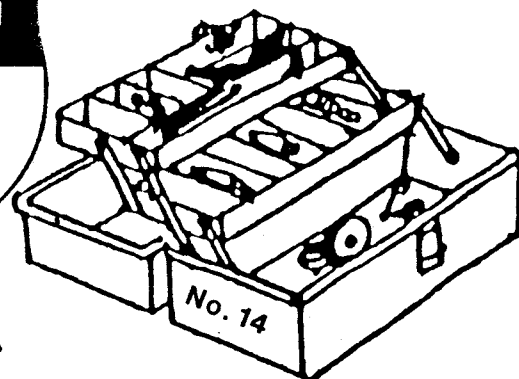
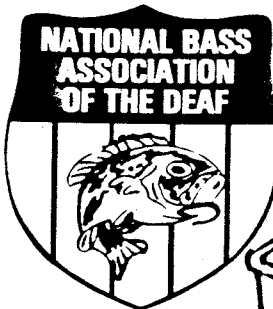

Bass Lunker Contest

For the morning time of Monday, June 15th for the Big Lunker Contest day, W.O. Schwall from Arkansas captured the first place leading with a big bass weighed 4.18 pounds and took home \$670. All prize money went to the rest from second to twelfth. in that afternoon time after that contest, there was again a General Meeting at lodge Conference Building, proceed by NBAD President Alan Rork for bidding for tournament sites and presentation of NBAD patches to rookies During the meeting, President Alan Rork announced that there were total 146 anglers Participating in the 1992 NBAD Team Tournament after the final closed registration. After that meeting was adjourned, there was a very special event, which is called Jr.NBAD's Fishing Derby, for the kids with parental guidances to catch any kind of fish. Surprised, many kids had their unforgotten pleasures of fishing and had brought many breams in for the weight-ins. Many Beautiful trophies were presented to several kids.

TEAM TOURNAMENT (DAY 1)

In the opening first day of Tuesday, June 16th, Joe Wilson and Ronald Smith from Missouri came out for the first place with 16 bass weighed 23.49 pounds. Second place went to Patrick Ferguson and Roger Kays from Oklahoma with 11 bass weighed 15.88 pounds. Thrid place went to Danny Cochran and Charles Penland from Tennessee with 8 bass weighed 9.56 pounds. Dennis Bacon from Missouri. formerly 1987 NBAD Champ at Lake Kentucky, had brought in a big bass weighed 4.28 pounds and took a lead for the big bass record. At the late afternoon time after the first day

tournament, the ranger from the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission gave an interested lecture about the natural wildlife at Lake Ouachita. At the evening time, All prize money and trophies were presented to the top 3-team and big lunker winners.

TEAM TOURNAMENT (DAY 2)

In the next second day of Wednesday, June 17th, Joe Wilson and Ronald Smith from Missouri again came out for the first place with 15 bass weighed 23.88 pounds. Also, second place went to Patrick Ferguson and Roger Kays from Oklahoma again with 5 bass weighed 13.21 pounds. Third place went to Norman Walker from Louisiana and Phillip Huckaby from Tennessee with 10 bass weighed 12.87 pounds. Patrick Ferguson had swung in a bigger bass weighed 6.41 pounds and got a step over Dennis Bacon's big bass leading record After that second day tournament, Bobby Murray, retired professional bass angler and formally won the first Bass Master Classic in 1971 at Lake Mead, Nevada, also gave a superb lecture and instruction of how to fish in the proper way in Lake Ouachita. At the evening time, All prize money and trophies were presented to the top 3-team and big lunker winners.

TEAM TOURNAMENT (FINAL)

The date of Thursday, June 18th was logged as the final day of the NBAD Team Tournament. Jerry Belew and David King from Arkansas formerly 1986 NBAD Champs at Bull Shoals Lake, came out for the first place with 7 bass weighed 18.08 pounds. Second place went to Keith James from Arkansas and Gene Amons from Louisian, formerly 4 times NBAD champs, with 10 bass weighed 15.45 pounds. Third place went to Norman Walker from Louisiana and Phillip Huckaby from Tennessee with 8 bass weighed 9.74 pounds. New biggest shock had came to all anglers and fans to see a biggest bass that Jerry

Belew had brought in. Jerry looked so nervous! It was finally weighed to be 9.07 pounds. Patrick Ferguson's big bass leading record was climbed down to second and Dennis Bacon's to third. All prize money and trophies were presented to them at the evening time. At the special evening in the same date, Jerry Belew and David King from Arkansas came in for the third place overall leads with 13 bass weighed 25.83 pounds and accepted \$750 in prize money and trophies. Patrick Ferguson and Roger Kays from Oklahoma also came in for the second place overall leads with 17 bass weighed 30 pounds and earned \$1000 in prize money and trophies. Joe Wilson and Ronald Smith from Missouri captured the new 1992 National Bass Association Team Tournament championships with 37 bass weighed 53.45 pounds and collected \$2000 in prize money and trophies. All prize money were presented to the rest from fourth to twenty-seventh after the first 3 teams. The Mowad Sportsmanship Award went to Karl Nygaard from Wisconsin. The Southwell Bassmaster Award went to Ronald Smith from Missouri with the leading heavy stringer of 21 bass weighed 33.49 pounds. The Award of Largest Bass Lunker through the 3-day Team Tournament went to Jerry Belew from Arkansas with 9.07 pounds. He also set the new NBAD official record of 9.07 pounds over the 16 year record of 7.11 pounds, that was caught by Late John Cloy from Louisiana, and again collected \$556. Bill Barnes and Pati Brown were presented the LRBAD Award by General Chairman W.O.Schwall for appreciating them and their great timeless supports to little Rock Bass Anglers of the Deaf during the NBAD week. A BIG thanks thanks went to Kristy Schwall for her great countless support as an interpreter.

At the last day of Friday, June 19th, We, all members of LRBAD and staff employees of Mountain Harbor Resort, Bade our big farewells to all who were leaving Arkansas for heading home with their great memories, include a special honorable memory of Joseph o. Broz, who was passed away on February 20, 1992.
